A friend posted a link to a crocheted version of these onto my facebook; I figured anything crocheters can do, knitters can do better. And so these were born... (aptly, given I was watching the Big Bang Theory at the time). No copyright infringement intended. Shaving eyebrows not advised.



The basic principle is having a fold at the top to put your ear in and then a fold at the bottom to catch the lobe underneath. I disclaim any liability for consequences if you mix these with earrings or any other ear piercings...

Cast on 3 stitches onto a double pointed needle.

- 1. Slide stitches to the opposite end of the needle, K3
- 2. Distribute onto 3 DPNs and join to work in the round, K3 (this is awkward, but works to make it pointy)
- 3. $[kfb] \times 3 = 6st$
- 4. K6
- 5. K6
- 6. P6
- 7. [kfb] x 2, k4
- 8. P8
- 9. K8
- 10. P8
- 11. K4, kfb, k1, k1, kfb
- 12. P10
- 13. K10
- 14. P10
- 15. [kfb, k1], repeat until end
- 16. P15

- 17. K15
- 18. P15
- 19. [kfb, k2], repeat until end
- 20. P20
- 21. K20
- 22. Cast off 2, p11, cast off 6, use last stitch as 1st stitch of next round
- 23. K12
- 24. K12
- 25. K12
- 26. K2tog, k8, k2tog
- 27. K10
- 28. K10
- 29. K10
- 30. K10
- 31. K10
- 32. K10
- 33. K2tog, k6, k2tog
- 34. K8
- 35. K8
- 36. K2tog, k4, k2tog
- 37. K6
- 38. Kfb, k4, kfb
- 39. K8
- 40. Kfb, k6, kfb
- 41. [k2tog, k1] to end
- 42. [k2tog] to last stitch, k1
- 43. Cast off

Sew in top end, and use bottom cast-off thread to fold the bottom flap up and give it a couple of stitches to keep the bottom of your ear nice and snuggly.
